ARC TUTORING POSITION OVERVIEW

Job Description

ARC tutors perform on a variety of responsibilities, including but not limited to:

- Providing academic assistance to students individually and in pairs
- Facilitating larger recitation-style review groups
- Assisting students in developing good learning strategies and habits
- Being present and on time for all tutoring appointments, required training, and team meetings
- Attend professional development workshops throughout the semester
- Maintaining accurate records and completing all required paperwork
- Communicating frequently with the assistant dean and administrative coordinator
- Helping strategize and develop new resources that can be offered by the ARC
- Participate in peer observation and feedback structure to facilitate ongoing development

Minimum Qualifications

The ideal ARC tutor will:

- Have earned an A- or better in the courses they are tutoring
- Have an overall GPA of 3.0 or better
- Possess excellent interpersonal and communication skills
- Demonstrate excellent time management and organizational skills
- Be comfortable working with a diverse student population
- Be assertive, able to take control of the tutorial and provide appropriate constructive feedback to students
- Be creative, able to explain material in several ways during one-on-one and group tutoring sessions
- Be willing to commit to at least one semester of consistent work with the ARC, working a minimum of four hours per week

Benefits and Compensation

ARC tutors are paid an hourly wage according to their previous educational experience. Current undergraduate students are paid \$20 per hour, and current graduate and postbac students are paid \$25 per hour. There are no insurance benefits attached to this position.

Additional benefits include:

- The opportunity to help others be a positive role model
- Increased mastery of academic skills
- Development of interpersonal skills
- Paid training and the opportunity to earn College Learning and Reading Association (CRLA) Tutoring Certification
- Valuable work experience for development of resumes and reference
