Attend New Student Orientation and GS Student Veteran Orientation
Incoming military-connected students will attend a veteran-specific orientation session and resource fair that will introduce them to the resources available to support their transition into student life at Columbia. This session is required for those veterans utilizing VA Educational Benefits.
