SPEAKER BIOS

LISA ROSEN-METSCH '90

Lisa Rosen-Metsch '90GS is the 9th Dean of the Columbia School of General Studies. She is the first alumna to serve as Dean of GS. Previously, she was the Chair and Stephen Smith Professor, Sociomedical Sciences at the Mailman School of Public Health. Dean Lisa Rosen-Metsch is a medical sociologist and an internationally recognized scholar whose work has focused on the social determinants of health with special focus on access to care for persons living with HIV and substance use disorders.

For the past two decades, her research has been continuously funded by the National Institutes of Health and has resulted in over260publicationsinhighimpactjournalsincludingtheJournal of the American Medical Association (JAMA), Addiction, and the American Journal of Public Health. Mentoring and teaching has always been a high priority for Dean Rosen-Metsch and she has won numerous teaching awards and co-directs a NIHfunded training program with the Columbia School of Social Work. For the past two years, Dr. Rosen-Metsch has taught a new seminar course in the Department of Sociology for undergraduates entitled "AIDS and US Society" that explored how the HIVAIDS epidemic transformed American society.

In her time as Dean, Columbia GS has significantly increased fundraising for student financial aid scholarships, created and launched new international dual-degree programs, new partnerships with community colleges and created new initiatives focused on social justice and women student veterans.

JILL GALAS HICKEY

Jill Galas Hickey is the Senior Associate Dean for Development and Alumni Relations at Columbia GS. Jill manages all development and alumni-related activities for GS and works closely with the Columbia Office of Alumni and Development to prioritize activities of the fundraising team related to GS initiatives.
